PROJECT DETAILS

In this workshop, participants will be able to select from a variety of projects, depending on their skill level. The projects vary in the amount of time and materials required. Requirements for each project are listed below in individual charts. Each chart indicates the skill level required for the project, the amount of time required, unfinished and finished sizes, and the type and quantity of materials needed. Depending on the complexity and time required for the project(s) you choose, it may be possible to complete more than one during the workshop. The amounts listed are estimates, based on the typical requirements for my own projects. The actual amounts required for your particular project(s) may vary, according to your individual style and preferences.

Participants shall choose projects commensurate with their skill level. Those who have never felted before may choose projects that are beginner-friendly. Those with some previous nuno felting experience may choose beginner to intermediate level projects. Intermediate to advanced level felters may chose any project.

Silk fabric and merino and silk roving will be available for purchase at the workshop. You are also welcome to bring your own materials. Unless otherwise specified, fibers and fabrics are un-dyed (natural).

JEWELRY: NECKLACE or COLLAR, CUFF, OR HATBAND

With smaller items such as jewelry, book covers, or pillows, etc., I may capture beads in the felt, or embellish with them later, for added interest and sparkle. For larger items, I prefer to allow the surface designs and hand-painting effects to be the focal point. Of course, this is entirely a personal preference and, if you desire to bring beads and crystals, you are welcome to do so. Bring a sewing needle and thread also. Before being captured in felt, beads must be attached to a scrap of fabric, or strung on thread, which is then captured and secured by wool fibers. Otherwise, beads that are not secured in this way tend to "escape."

MATERIALS & SUPPLIES LIST

Plastic, 1 package: 2mm painter's plastic dropcloth, approx. 9'x12'

Measuring tape

Calculator

Fabric scissors, also bring a 2nd pair if you don't want to cut kraft paper with your fabric scissors

Spray bottle, for water, should be able to spray a mist.

Small plastic tub or bucket, 1 qt. yogurt size or 1 gal. ice cream tub would suffice

Ball brause(r) or sprinkling device

Old towels, 3 or 4 large

Wide bubble wrap, for fulling, not rolling, needs to be at least 24" wide x 30" long. Two narrow pieces of bubble wrap can be taped together using packaging or duct tape.

Plastic apron or protective clothing

Plastic cups for holding dyes, 6-10, I like to use cottage cheese or yogurt tubs. Solo cups will work also, but other types may melt or shrink when hot dye is added to them.

Brushes, 1.5" inexpensive, any type of bristle. Will need 2-6, or use one and keep rinsing it out. (I get packages of 6 "chip" brushes at Home Depot)

Half inch artist brush for details
